THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

bring a third horse.

The individual athletes may choose whether they bring a second horse for the non-championship competitions

or a youngster.

The fifth team member may compete in the non-

championship competitions.

Only athletes and horses that have obtained a certificate of capability are eligible to take part in the Championship competitions.

All Athletes & Horses participating in any International competition must be registered with the FEI.

Athletes and/or Horses present at the event without having been entered through the FEI's Online Entry System will automatically be disqualified, unless compelling circumstances warrant otherwise!

FEI Entry System and HippoBase: Entries made via the FEI Online Entry system do not have to be made in HippoBase again. When the OC accepts the entries in the FEI system they will transfer riders and horses to HippoBase. Once copied NFs are kindly requested to provide the additional information in the HippoBase System.



NFs please note: A show might not be listed in HippoBase before the OC has transferred your entries. The synchronization procedure between the two systems is based on FEI-IDs of athletes and horses; entries existing in both system will be detected and will not create duplicates.

Minimum Eligibility Requirements and Certificates of Capability

Championship Horses

In order to be eligible to be included on the list of Nominated Entries, all Athletes and Championship Horses must have achieved the Minimum Eligibility Requirements and must strictly follow the qualification procedure as published on the FEI Website. The deadline date for achieving the Minimum Eligibility Requirements is: **22.07.2015**

Jumping entries must be made via the FEI Online Entry System. Following the completion of the Nominated Entries, National Federations must generate and download the Certificate of Capability online by clicking on the button 'Certificate of Capability' (1 Certificate per National Federation). Once the Certificate is downloaded it must be printed, signed by the President of the National Federation and submitted to the FEI Jumping Department (FAO Marijn Dubbeldam –

<u>marijn.dubbeldam@fei.org</u>). Nominated Entries must be completed and Certificates of Capability must be submitted to the FEI by: **22.07.2015**



Athletes and Championship Horses that have achieved the Minimum Eligibility Requirements through a Special Qualifying Competition a Record of Result will need to be submitted to the FEI together with the Certificate of Capability. This Record of Result can be downloaded from the FEI Online Entry System. Please note that it is not necessary for Athletes and Championship Horses to achieve their Minimum Eligibility Requirements as a combination. Following the completion of Nominated Entries, the FEI will check and approve the eligibility of all nominated Athletes and Championship Horses. Definite Entries can only be made from the Nominated Entry list.

Non-Championship Horses

Non-Championship horses will also need to be entered at the same time as the Championship Horses with the Nominated Entries in the FEI Online Entry System indicating in the comment box 'Non-Championship Horse'. They do not need to have met the Minimum Eligibility Requirements for the Non-Championship competitions. These horses will appear on the generated Certificate of Capability following the completion of the Nominated Entries however they must be indicated as 'Non-Championship Horse' on the Certificate before submitting it to the FEI.

All Entries must be made by the Athletes' own National Federation.

Substitutions:

Art. 319.2.:

Athletes and Horses entered for a Championship on the list of nominated entries (four weeks before the Championship) can be replaced and additions can be made within the limits specified in GRs Art. 116.4.2 until the date of definite entries (maximum 10 days before the start of the Championship).

In the event of an accident or illness of an Athlete and/or Horse, substantiated by a certificate from an official recognised doctor and/or veterinarian, between the date of definite entries and one hour before the first Horse Inspection of the Championship, substitutions of Athletes and/or Horses can be made. Such substitutions must be taken from the updated list of nominated entries and require Ground Jury approval.

Art. 320.2: 2.

In the event of an accident or illness of an Athlete and/or Horse between the submission of declarations and one hour before the start of the first championship Competition, the Athlete and/or the Horse may, on production of a certificate from an officially recognised doctor and/or with the permission of the Veterinary Commission and after approval of the President of the Ground Jury and the Appeal Committee, be replaced by another Athlete and/or Horse formally entered with the definite entries or substituted according to Art. 319.2.

Grooms will be expected to use their own lorry as accommodation. The lorry park will be located on the show grounds and an adequate number of electricity hookups will be provided.

Accommodation for grooms, if requested with the nominated entries will be at the expense of the OC. (Art. 322.2)

For grooms not staying in lorries/caravans the Organiser may provide a limited number of sleeping quarters in army barracks, under the condition that the OC receives such requests by date of the entries in principle.

OC provides proper sanitary conditions, which includes sufficient showering facilities for both male and female grooms with hot and cold water. Shower facilities as well as restrooms should at all times be in a state of cleanliness.

Meals:

Meals will be offered at OC expense from 17/08/2015 to 23/08/2015.

3. HORSES

The OC will pay a lump sum for the travelling and transportation expenses of 60 € per horse competing at the CH-EU-S, 5 qualified horses per team. (not for non-championship competition horses).

All Horses will be stabled on the show grounds from 17/08/2015 to 23/08/2015; stabling will be free of charge.

Additional horses not officially participating at the CH-EU-S/CSIYH1*/non-championship competitions Aachen cannot be brought along.

4. WELCOME (ARRIVAL HORSES)

Monday, August 17th, 2015: from 08.00 hours onwards.

An earlier arrival is not possible due to the change of horses between the disciplines of the first and second week of the European Championships.

5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS / AIRPORT SHUTTLE SERVICE / PARKING

A Shuttle-Service for chefs d'equipe and athletes from the airport (Cologne/Bonn, Duesseldorf (but not Düsseldorf-Weeze), Brussels or Maastricht-Aachen Airport/NL) and from the hotel to the show grounds and back is provided from Monday, August 17st until Sunday, August 23rd 2015, daily between 06.30-00.30 hours. On Monday, August 24th, 2015 the shuttle service will only be available until 12.00 noon. Please order the shuttle at least 24 hours in advance at showoffice@chioaachen.de.

Each team will receive one parking pass. Additional parking passes on request and according to availability.



IX. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

1. ADVERTISING ON ATHLETES AND HORSES:

At the Team Competition the athletes are only authorized to carry the logo of the Team and/or NF sponsor.

At all other competitions athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor Team and/or NF sponsor, in accordance with Art. 256.3 and 257.3 of the FEI Rules for Jumping.

The Chief Steward will check that the advertising on Athletes and horses complies with these Articles.

2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITION

Individual European Champion: Prize of the Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany for the winning athlete: Trophy

3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The number of athletes required to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of the non-EC competitions is 8. The participation in the prize-giving ceremony and the lap of honour is obligatory for all placed athletes. A horse other than the competition horse can be taken. This does not refer to the medal ceremony for which the competition horse must be taken.

MEDAL CEREMONY

The number of athletes/teams required to present themselves for the medal ceremony is 3. Following the official medal ceremonies, the OC on behalf of the City Mayor of Aachen requests that all medallists (individuals and teams) take part at additional presenting ceremonies in the City of Aachen on the stage at the market square.

CLOSING CEREMONY

The individual gold medal winner is kindly invited to attend the closing ceremony.

4.INSURANCES

All athletes, owners, trainers, team veterinarians and their accompaniments are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees/grooms, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out a third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date. The OC will **NOT** be responsible for any damage caused by athletes, their horses, owners, NF officials, their employees/grooms or their representatives.

The FEI insures all FEI Officials, whose names are published in the FEI Officials lists, against third party liability including Judges, Course Designers, Technical Delegates, FEI Stewards, FEI Veterinary Delegates, Para Classifiers, Members of the Judges' Supervisory Panel and FEI Coaches (FEI EADCMP Veterinarians are covered under a different policy):



- Who are acting for or on behalf of the FEI as stated in the approved schedule of the Event or who are acting in the scope and course of the FEI's Business as described in the final approved schedule; and
- Who have received the status of FEI Officials at FEI Events through a qualification process

The FEI will NOT insure:

- National officials officiating at FEI Events; and/or
- FEI Officials, who have no official function at the Event.

The insurance extended is for any liability that the FEI Official incurs to a third party, and for the costs of defending any such claim arising as a result of actions undertaken by the FEI Official in good faith (including errors and omissions) on behalf of the FEI. However, the insurance for obvious reasons does not extend to any liabilities incurred as a result of an FEI Official's dishonest, fraudulent, malicious, and/or illegal act.

Should an FEI Official become aware of an incident that he or she believes might result in a claim, that FEI Official should notify the FEI immediately and provide all of the facts known to the FEI Official. The FEI cannot guarantee the insurance coverage described above in circumstances where the FEI Official has good cause to believe that there might be a claim and does not provide such timely notice directly to the FEI.

FEI Permitted Treating Veterinarians (PTVs) (Art 1005) are to have adequate professional indemnity insurance.

LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements.

Furthermore the OC also declines any liability for theft or other incidents. By making the definite entries each athlete declares that he/she has taken notice of the schedule and the exclusion of the liability as set out in the schedule and that the athlete explicitly agrees therewith.

5.ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS / ACCREDITED PERSONS

Accreditation / Show Passes Jumping

Opening times of the accreditation office:

Saturday, August 8^{th} , until Sunday, August 23^{rd} , 2015, daily from 8 a.m. until 8 p.m. These times are subject to change and depend on the final time schedule. Please check the final opening times at the venue.

Free show passes will only be granted if the required information has been entered into HippoBase by the respective NF at the latest by the closing date of the definite entries.

The show passes will be valid from August 17th to 23rd, 2015.

8.PROTESTS/APPEALS

To be valid, all Protests and Appeals must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

9.MODIFICATION OF SCHEDULE

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER, the Chefs d'Equipe and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Unforeseen circumstances do not include situations arising as a result of the OC altering the approved Schedule without FEI's authorisation. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and they must be reported to the FEI Secretary General by the President of the Ground Jury.

10.SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

11.DISPUTES

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

12.RESULTS

In order to proceed with the results publication and for qualification purposes the FEI requires results **to be uploaded directly on the FEI Database** within five days after the conclusion of the event.

All results must include FEI Passport Registration number of horses and FEI ID number of Athletes.

13.BETTING

Betting will not be authorised by the OC.

14.STEWARDING

- If an athlete is uncertain as to whether the boots he/she intends to use during an event are allowed, he/she or his/her representative should show the boots to the Chief Steward for his/her opinion before the boots are used in training or in competition.
- In addition, athletes are to be made aware that hind boots must be removed and
 placed again on the horse's legs in the presence of a Steward while in the warm-up
 arena prior to entering the competition arena for certain competitions. (If bandages
 are used in place of boots, athletes are not required to remove the bandages in the
 warm-up arena.)



- This procedure is compulsory for competitions for which boot and bandage control
 is mandatory, that is the Nations Cup, Grand Prix, and the competition with the
 highest prize money, and is at the discretion of the Chief Steward for other
 competitions.
- As an alternative to carrying out this procedure at the time designated by the Steward an athlete may ask his/her groom to take the boots to the in-gate and place them on the horse's legs in front of the Steward prior to the combination entering the arena.
- The Steward has the authority to intervene if a boot is deemed excessively tight by
 instructing that the boot be removed and put on again correctly. [Stewards are to
 note that it is normal for a horse's gait to be somewhat affected immediately after
 boots have been removed and re-placed.] If an athlete or his/her groom refuses to
 remove and re-place the boot(s) when instructed to do so by the Steward, a Yellow
 Warning Card will be issued to the athlete in question.
- If it is deemed impossible or unsafe to remove the hind boots in the warm-up arena
 prior to the combination entering the competition arena, due to an extremely excited
 or nervous horse, the boots of the horse in question are to be removed by the
 athlete/groom following the athlete's round upon leaving the arena and inspected
 by the Steward. This inspection may be carried out during the boot and bandage
 control if the boot and bandage control is carried out for the competition in question.

This procedure does not replace boot and bandage control after completion of an athlete's round for competitions for which boot and bandage control is mandatory (refer to JRs Art. 244.1).

15.COURSE INSPECTIONS

are only permitted during the allowed time and in the official riding clothes.

16.HORSE LORRIES

Horse lorries of the athletes (max. one caravan or trailer per athlete) can be parked on the show grounds, but **not inside the stable area**, for the duration of the respective discipline. Electricity is supplied through installations at the assigned place. Cable is to be supplied by the owner of the lorry.

Athletes, whose horses leave the show grounds without special permission of the OC during the competition after the first horse inspection until one half hour after the announcement of the results of the last competition - will be disqualified.

17.IMAGES

In accordance with Art. 135.1 of the FEI General Regulations article, the OC reserves the right to use still images of Athletes/Horses taken during the Event for promotional and non-commercial purposes.

18.MOTORISED VEHICLES OR MOTORBIKES

are strictly prohibited on the entire show grounds incl. the stables.

19.DOGS

are strictly prohibited on the entire show grounds incl. the stables.



20.ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SHOW GROUND REGULATIONS

As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all athletes, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the ALRV show ground regulations and rules of the official show schedule, to acknowledge and keep within the German Animal and Welfare Laws and Guidelines, and to behave according to the ethical principles in common practice. (on www.aachen2015.com)

Violations will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee. The acknowledgement of the above is to be confirmed in writing upon receipt of the show pass. As soon as NFs have presented their entries, all athletes, also on behalf of the horse owners, as well as their employees/grooms, representatives and accompaniments, are obliged, from the moment of arrival on the show grounds, to acknowledge and keep within the "Code of Conduct".

Violation of this code will be dealt with by the respective Ground Jury or Appeal Committee, in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the FEI.

VETERINARY REGULATIONS (VRs), 14th edition, effective 1st January 2015

1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

The forwarding agency will inform about all necessary conditions of importation.

All customs documents (T-1 documents) are to be submitted at the latest by the first day of competition to the entry office.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL

In accordance with the FEI Code of Conduct it is imperative that all Horses at FEI Events are physically fit and free from infectious disease before being allowed to compete.



ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is obliged to deliver all necessary health certificates for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 (see annex Vet. I) of the actual valid form will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not belonging to the EU, a health certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II (see Annex Vet. II) of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. NATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

4. TRANSPORT OF HORSES

Horses must be fit to travel and be transported in vehicles suitable for the transport of horses. Any government requirements for disease testing and control must be requested well in advance, to ensure that the Horse is in compliance by the time of arrival at the border of the country where the Event is taking place. Athletes, or their representatives, have the responsibility to be in compliance with national legislation in both their country of origin, and the host nation of the Event; where necessary Athletes must contact local government authorities or veterinary advisors for information regarding animal health requirements and transport legislation. Within the European Union (EU), this includes EU Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 concerning the protection of animals during transport within the Member States of the EU.



5. VENUE ARRIVAL INFORMATION & FITNESS TO COMPETE

PASSPORTS

General Regulations Article 137

For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation

All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI.

FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events, with the exception of CNs and CIMs as outlined below.

Athletes who do not present a Horse's Passport and/or Recognition Card, or one that is not correctly validated, or failing to meet other passport requirements including micro-chipping, vaccination, Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication control (Veterinary Regulations Article 1030), will be **subject to Sanctions in accordance with Annex II of the Veterinary Regulations** and may not be allowed to compete.

Athletes will be required to write their name and counter sign next to any passport irregularity entry noted, as an acknowledgement, prior to receiving the passport and leaving the show ground. Following a warning being issued for such an irregularity the Athlete will have 30 days to correct this. Failure to correct such irregularities within 30 days will result in a sanction being imposed.

Note for Horses permanently resident in a Member State of the European Union, all Horses must have a national EU passport in compliance with EU Regulations, to which a FEI Recognition card is applied. The exception to this being Horses in possession of an FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without interruption.

VACCINATIONS - EQUINE INFLUENZA 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1028

Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations and as summarised below.

Exceptions to the requirement for FEI equine influenza vaccinations currently exist only for those Horses competing at CNs or CIMs where there are no national requirements for influenza vaccination in both the Event host country and the Horse's country of origin (General Regulations Article 137).

EXAMINATION ON ARRIVAL 2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1032

On arrival at an Event venue all Horses must undergo an examination by a veterinarian to confirm their identification from their passport, and micro-chip (where present), their vaccination status and general health. To protect all horses attending events, any Horse with a questionable health status, with regards to vaccination, disease or other concerns, must be stabled within the isolation facilities provided by the Organising Committee pending a decision on entering the venue.

HORSE INSPECTIONS

2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1033, Table 2

All Horses will be assessed for their orthopaedic fitness to compete during the Horse Inspection.

Any Horse demonstrating questionable fitness may be referred to the Holding Box for further veterinary examination. Horses not deemed fit to compete by the Inspection Panel will not be permitted to compete.

LIMB SENSITIVITY EXAMINATION

2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1034

Horses are not eligible to compete when a limb, or part of a limb, is hyposensitive or hypersensitive (both of which shall constitute "abnormal limb sensitivity"). Hypersensitive limbs have an excessive or abnormal reaction to palpation. Hyposensitive limbs include any alteration in sensitivity induced by a neurectomy or chemical desensitisation for as long as the alteration in sensitivity persists.



All Horses are subject to Examination under the Protocol for abnormal limb sensitivity throughout the Period of an Event, including, but not limited to, between rounds and before the Jump Off. Horses may be examined once or on multiple occasions during the Period of an Event.

Horses may be selected for Examination under the Protocol randomly or they may be targeted. All Horses selected to be tested must submit promptly to the Examination or are subject to immediate Disqualification. There is no obligation to examine any specific number of Horses at an Event.

6. <u>EQUINE ANTI-DOPING AND CONTROLLED MEDICATION PROGRAMME</u> (<u>EADCMP</u>)

2015 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter VI

Within FEI Groups I & II, the Organising Committee should charge athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 towards the cost of the EADCMP, which is overseen by the FEI Veterinary Department.

SAMPLING

All horses competing at FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of FEI Equine Prohibited Substances in accordance with the FEI Equine Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses may be selected for sampling in accordance with obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures (2015 Veterinary Regulations Article 1057 and 1058).

CLEAN SPORT INFORMATION

The current FEI Equine Prohibited Substances List of Banned Substances and Controlled Medications (the EPSL) is available on the FEI Clean Sport website: www.FEICleanSport.org as a PDF document, database or smart phone app. Detection times are also provided for a limited number of Controlled Medication substances where available.

Elective Testing (Art.1056) may be carried out, by Competitors for their Horses, prior to an Event to check for the presence of prohibited substances (please refer to www.FEI.org/veterinary for information and details.

7. PONIES

For all Pony Events, Ponies must be available for Pony Measurement prior to the Horse Inspection and throughout the event be subject to the requirements of the 2015 Veterinary Regulations, Chapter IV.

8. INJURY SURVEILLANCE (Art. 1035)

Horses participating in FEI Events are subject to injury surveillance protocols; such information is essential to ensure that (i) the Horse's welfare remains paramount at all times and (ii) sound scientific reasoning is applied to the safety of all Horses and Athletes participating at Events. Official Veterinarians are required to report on each injured horse at an event.

XI. HUMAN ANTI-DOPING

At a minimum, and pursuant to Article 22.3 of the ADRHAs, Organisers must provide the following at Events where the FEI informs the Organiser at least two (2) months before the Event that human anti-doping testing is scheduled to take place at the Event:

- 1. One (1) staff member able to act as point of contact and coordinator for the *Doping Control Officers* (*DCOs*) with the contact name and details of this staff member to be communicated to the *FEI* at least two (2) weeks prior to the starting date of the *Event*.
- **2.** Human anti-doping facilities reasonably separated from public activity, consisting of:
 - one (1) private room exclusively dedicated for use by the *DCOs* with one (1) table, two (2) chairs, pens and paper and one (1) lockable fridge; and
 - a waiting room/area with a suitable number of chairs as well as an appropriate amount of individually sealed, non-caffeinated and non alcoholic beverages, which includes a mix of natural mineral water and soft drinks; and
 - one (1) private and clean bathroom/toilet, adjacent or as near as possible to the *DCO* room and waiting area.
- **3.** Staff members (or volunteers) of both genders, able to act as *Chaperones*. The number of *Chaperones* available to the OC must be communicated to the FEI as early as possible following receipt by the OC of the Testing plan for the Event. Please see the qualifications for Chaperones in the ADRHAs.

Settlement of accounts per athlete

Reimbursement of prize-money will be paid out **by bank transfer** per athlete (not per horse resp. per horse owner) within 21 days after the European Championships. For this purpose the NF´s are requested to state the bank information (name of recipient, bank name, bank code, account number, IBAN and BIC codes) of their athletes together with the online entries in HippoBase.

In case the money transaction does not go through due to incorrect or incomplete bank information, the OC reserves the right to charge a lump sum of $80,-\mathbb{C}$ for any handling fees charged by the bank.

The Organising Committee is authorised to deduct any possible outstanding duties from the payment. Each athlete is obliged to forward the prize-money as well as any reimbursement to the respective horse owner.

Each athlete is obliged to check and sign the final account at the accounting office before departure. The horse passports will only be handed out after the accounts have been settled.

Taxation of Foreign Horse Owners, Athletes and Grooms:

According to § 50a - Abs. 4 EStG of the German Tax Rights the OC must detain tax (withholding tax on income earned) from all accounts paid out to foreign horse owners, athletes and grooms.

The horse owners and athletes can apply for exemption of these taxes at the Central Federal Office for Finances, if the lawful requirements are met: Bundeszentralamt für Steuern, An der Küppe 1, 53225 Bonn, Germany, phone: (49) 228-4060, fax: (49) 228-4062661. An exemption of these taxes is only possible if the appropriate certificate is submitted. The documents for the exemption of tax can be downloaded from the website www.bzst.bund.de. Subject to change.

IMPORTANT

The total amount of prize money shown for each Competition in the schedule must be distributed. (GR Art 127, 128)

For details of the Breakdown for each competition please refer to the tables at the end of this document; the OC must specify which of the two tables will be used. The total prize money for the competition must be distributed among the first 12 placed athletes. The OC must provide additional created prizes for athletes placed beyond 12th place. The minimum amount for each of these additional prizes, for athletes placed from 13th to last place, must be clearly specified in the approved schedule and not exceed the prize money of the athlete placed 12th.

Teams - The starting order of the teams qualified to compete is set according to the reverse order of total penalties of the best three competitors per team incurred in the first individual competition and the best three competitors per team in Round 1 of the team competition. Teams with equality of penalties retain the starting order of Round 1.

Classification – Team Placing:

The ten teams and those with equality of penalties for tenth place receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the best three competitors in each team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each of the two rounds of the second competition. The team, which has obtained the least number of penalties will be placed first and declared FEI European Team Champion.

In the event of equality of penalties between teams for first, second and/or third place, there will be a jump-off against the clock in which all team competitors may take part, over six obstacles, which may be increased in height and/or spread at a speed of 400 m/m. The score in this jump-off is obtained by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team, but in the event of further equality of penalties, the times of these 3 athletes in the jump-off added together will decide the winning team as well as those placed second or third. The score of this jump-off is only to determine the placing of the teams and will not count towards the final scores of the individual athletes.

If two jump-offs are required, the jump-off for the third place shall precede the jump-off for the first and the second place. If after the jump-off there is equality of penalties and time for one of the first three places, the teams concerned will be placed equal.

Teams not qualified for the second round of the team competition receive their placing by adding the penalties incurred by the three best competitors in each team in the first competition and the penalties incurred by the three competitors in the first round of the team competition.
